White Flesh Watermelons

WM16-20 - Citron Red Watermelons

100 days. Citrullus lanatus. Open Pollinated. The plant produces high yields of small dark green watermelons. This is not your typical watermelon. It has white flesh with red seeds. The flesh is tasteless and is used to make preserves and sweetmeats that are added to fruitcakes, cookies, and puddings. It got its name from the unique appearance of its white flesh with bright red seeds! The best ones can be stored for up to a year.



Drought-Tolerant. A variety that was widely grown in the 1930s and 1940s. An excellent choice for home gardens.

WM25-10 - Cream of Saskatchewan Watermelons

85 days. Citrullus lanatus. Open Pollinated. The plant produces good yields of 10 lb white watermelons. The watermelons are very sweet and crisp and flavorful. The plant does well in the New England region. An excellent choice for home gardens and specialty market growers. A variety from Russia.
