

Green Cotton

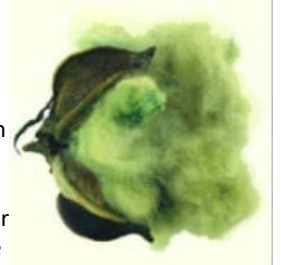
[CO4-5 - Arkansas Green Cotton Seeds](#)

140 days. *Gossypium hirsutum*. Open Pollinated. Arkansas Green Cotton. The plant produces good yields of green-tinted cotton. The color of the cotton is light green to dull olive green. The plant has pink and white flowers which makes it a very attractive plant against reddish-green foliage. Naturally colored cotton is now very rare. Prior to the Civil War, green, blue, yellow, and pink-colored cotton was grown by slaves. An excellent choice for home gardens. An heirloom variety from Arkansas. United States Department of Agriculture, PI 528420.

130 days. *Gossypium hirsutum*. Open Pollinated. Erlene's Green Cotton. The plant produces good yields of naturally olive green tinted cotton. Naturally colored cotton is now very rare. Prior to the Civil War, green, blue, yellow, and pink colored cotton was grown by slaves. An excellent choice for home gardens. An heirloom variety from the family of Erlene Melancon of Texas, USA.

130 days. *Gossypium hirsutum*. Open Pollinated. Louisiana Green Cotton. The plant produces good yields of naturally green tinted cotton. Naturally colored cotton is now very rare. Before the Civil War, green, blue, yellow, and pink colored cotton was grown by slaves. An excellent choice for home gardens and school projects. An heirloom variety from Louisiana, USA.
