[CT10-750 - Little Fingers Carrot Seeds](#)

65 days. *Daucus carota*. Open Pollinated. Little Fingers Carrot. The plant produces good yields of 3 to 5" long finger-size deep orange carrots. One of our most popular baby carrots. Excellent for gourmet dishes, salads, soups, and stews. Suitable for containers, pots, small gardens, square foot gardens, patios, and raised gardens for those with small garden spaces. Ideal for eating fresh, canning, or pickling. Plant these carrots from March to July for a continuous supply right into early winter. An excellent choice for home gardens. A variety developed in France.



[CT41-750 - Nantes Fancy Carrot Seeds](#)

68 days. *Daucus carota*. Open Pollinated. Nantes Fancy Carrot. The plant produces good yields of 5 to 8" long orange carrots. The carrots are smooth and cylindrical. It holds well in the field and keeps well. An excellent choice for home gardens and market growers. Developed in the region of Nantes, France. Disease Resistant: ALS.



[CT13-750 - Scarlet Nantes Carrot Seeds](#)

75 days. *Daucus carota*. Open Pollinated. Scarlet Nantes Carrot. The plant produces good yields of flavorful 6 to 8" long orange carrots. Carrots are very delicate and fine-grained containing almost no core. It is tender, crisp, and ultra-sweet. An excellent quality carrot for salads, soups, stews, and making carrot juice. This variety stores well. Grows well in heavier soils. An excellent choice for home gardens. United States Department of Agriculture, NSL 6191. An 1870s heirloom variety from Nantes, France.
