

Red Corn

CN9-50 - Bloody Butcher Corn

105 days. Zea mays. Open Pollinated. The plant produces good yields of 8 to 12" long ears of red corn. There are 2 to 6 ears per stalk. These ears weigh approximately ½ pounds. It can be eaten fresh when young as corn on the cob or used to make flour and cornmeal. Withstands heavy winds, drought, and heat. Heat-Tolerant. Drought-Tolerant.

An excellent choice for home gardens. An 1845 heirloom variety from Virginia, USA.
