Perfect for making pies and custards. Excellent keeper stores well for 6



months. It was grown by Thomas Jefferson at Monticello, Virginia. An heirloom variety that was introduced in the 1780s from Jamaica via the slave trade. An excellent choice for home gardens. United States Department of Agriculture, NSL 5197. A winter squash variety.
