TR35-20 - Japanese Black Pine Bonsai Tree

Pinus thunbergii. Open Pollinated. This Bonsai tree produces has small bright green evergreen needles. The needles are in fascicles of two with a white sheath at the base. The bark is gray on young trees and small branches, changing to black and plated on larger branches and the trunk. It has resistance to pollution and salt and is a popular horticultural tree. A variety is native to Japan.



TR33-20 - Japanese Larch Bonsai Tree

Larix kaempferi. Open Pollinated. This Bonsai tree produces has small green evergreen needles. The crown is broad conic, both the main branches and the side branches are level, the side branches only rarely drooping. It is used for ornamental purposes in parks and gardens. Disease Resistant. A variety is native to Japan.



TR37-20 - Japanese Yew Bonsai Tree

Taxus cuspidata. Open Pollinated. This Bonsai tree produces has small bright green evergreen needles. This tree can be trimmed to a pleasingly pyramidal shape, and typically grows in conical formation. Also known as Spreading Yew Bonsai Tree. A variety is native to Japan.
