

## Peppers (Hot)

### HP749-20 - Tiny Samoa Hot Peppers

75 days. Capsicum annum. Open Pollinated. This small plant produces high yields of  $\frac{3}{4}$ " long by  $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide Pequin hot peppers. Peppers are very hot, grow upright, have thin flesh, and turn from green to red when mature. The plant has green stems, green leaves, and white flowers. A beautiful edible ornamental for indoor plants, containers, pots, patios, hanging baskets, and small gardens. A variety from Samoa.
