### BT13-100 - Bull's Blood Beet Seeds

33 to 58 days. Beta vulgaris. Open Pollinated. Bull's Blood Beets. The plant produces good yields of 2 to 4" diameter sweet dark red beets. It has the reddest foliage of any other beet. The high-quality beet can be used as a baby beet or full-size beet. Dark reddish-purple leaves can be used as an addition to mesclun mixes and salads. Roots are dark red and are perfect for canning. The beets are ideal for boiling, pickling, baking, and freezing. Heat Tolerant. Cold Tolerant. An 1840 heirloom variety from the Netherlands. An excellent choice for home gardens. ### BT25-100 - Detroit Supreme Beet Seeds

60 days. Beta vulgaris. Open Pollinated. Detroit Supreme Beet. The plant produces good yields of globe shaped dark red beets. This is an improved version of the Detroit Dark Red Beets with higher yields. The beet has blood red flesh. The beets do not get woody, so perfect for canning and pickling. The glossy green medium tops make tangy boiling greens. It will grow even under adverse weather conditions, even in hot weather. Perfect for salads and pickling.
